



Overview of Transnational Higher Education Programs of the European Faculty of Law

The Centre for International Studies is above all responsible for organisation and provision of **internationalized study programmes**, including **joint programmes, transnational higher education, mobility and research**. It is thus responsible for cooperation with foreign higher education and research institutions, within international research projects, and for international conferences, symposia, publishing as well as professional and scientific counselling.

In 2015, the **European Faculty of Law** and **Graduate School of Government and European Studies** have set out to internationalize the accredited second and third cycle study programmes within the Consortium of Graduate Schools.

Both higher education institutions joined their potential and experience in **the Consortium of Graduate Schools** to further open up to the global community with combined excellence in education and research.

The Consortium of Graduate Schools is entering the international world of education with a joint and uniform offer of study programmes in English language, the contents of which have been upgraded to comparative international and EU issues. As such, they are intended for foreign students within transnational education, the respective e-study, (Erasmus) student exchange, development of future joint programmes and for Slovenian students who wish to additionally upgrade their knowledge at the European and global level.

Internationalisation is based on the following objectives:

Create the benefit of educational, linguistical and cultural enrichment from the experience of studying and researching in Slovenia or abroad.



Promote cooperation between higher education and research institutions and enrich the educational environment of host institutions.

Contribute to the development of a pool of well-qualified, open-minded and internationally experienced young people as future professionals and scientists.

The European Faculty of Law and Graduate School of Government and European Studies together offer **nine internationalized second cycle and third cycle programmes:**

- **Law** (Master's and doctoral programme),
- **Law and Management of Real Estate** (Master's and doctoral programme),
- **Alternative Dispute Resolution** (Master's programme),
- **International and Diplomatic Studies** (Master's and doctoral programme),
- **Civil and Commercial Law - European Private Law** (Master's programme), and
- **Public Administration - European Public Law** (Master's programme).

In 2015, the Consortium of Graduate Schools has **taken further steps to develop and implement the cooperation between the Consortium and its international partners.**

Developed cooperation partnerships:

1. **USA:** Joint Degree Program between Mississippi College School of Law, Jackson, USA and European Faculty of Law, Slovenia. This international education program is the first of its kind in Slovenia.
2. **Turkey:** Istanbul Aydin University – Erasmus + Agreement
3. **Croatia:** University College EFFECTUS, College for Finance and Law Zagreb – enhanced cooperation
4. **Kosovo:** College European School of Law and Government (ESLG), Pristina
5. **Belarus:** International University "MITSO"
